20mph zone through Dursley and 30mph through Cam

On Monday 15th June Gloucestershire County Council held a Cam to Dursley Road Safety and Speed Reduction Proposals Pre-Engagement Event. Proposals include reducing the 40mph along Tiltdown and Cam Pitch to 30mph as well as an extensive 20mph zone outside Rednock and through into Dursley.

Following discussions at the GCC Strategic Development meetings, initial comments would support the reduction to 30mph along Tiltdown and Cam Pitch but ask that consideration be given to extending the 30mph along the Dursley Road (currently 40mph).

CPC has requested a joint meeting with the GCC TRO team, Safer Road team and Development management team as there will be a knock-on effect if these speed reduction measures are implemented before the TRO measures along Everlands and Hopton are finalised.

Discussions are ongoing

Everlands and Hopton TRO

GCC received 31 comments to the proposals. They will now have to consider the merits of each comment and decide whether there is any justification.

Comments to remove the speed cushions along Everlands have been received by the Clerk who replied to say the Parish would not support alterations to the proposals along this stretch as it does not support the wider aims of the Pedersen Way.

Bus stop painting

The design for the third bus stop in the series has been finalised and the bus stop has been prepped ready.

Telephone Kiosk refurbishment

The telephone kiosk from Draycott has been refurbished and we are waiting a date to complete the concrete pad and take delivery.



Severn Trent road closures

Severn Trent continue to work on sites at Woodfields and Draycott. Extensive potholing has been completed between 15 and 72 Woodfield Rd to prepare for laying the new sewer main. During this process, they discovered a High Voltage cable very close to the proposed alignment which must be tested by National Grid so has caused a slight delay.

They are producing a short article for our Newsletter and social media to give a more formal update.

Local Plan update

Stroud District Council's Call for Sites closes on 29 June 2026. This process invites landowners and developers to suggest land that could be considered for future housing, employment or other development as part of the Emerging Local Plan.

The Parish Council is aware that a number of sites in and around Cam may be submitted. It is important to note that a site being put forward does not mean it will be allocated for development or receive planning permission. The Call for Sites is simply the first stage in gathering potential options for assessment.

The Parish Council will be notified of submissions and will continue to engage with SDC through our monthly meetings.

There will be further opportunities for residents to view and comment on any sites that are shortlisted or proposed for allocation in due course.

SDC will also be consulting on the Spatial Strategy. Town and Parish Councils will be invited to workshops. The wider public consultation will be on line only.

Sundeala site

The sale of the Sundeala site is still underway. Whilst they haven't completed yet, they are hoping to do so in the coming weeks.

Cam Green play area

A disability audit was completed and emphasised the need for safe, accessible parking. Deputy has submitted a pre-planning application and is working on car park designs as well as further redevelopment of the play equipment.

Jubilee paths to be resurfaced

Work will shortly be starting on the paths around Jubilee to fix the cracks.
